Background



- Perspectives on Sustainability was offered from March-May 2013 as an open online course to any staff or students in the University
- Large numbers (840 by the end)
- Some students took the module for credit for the Nottingham Advantage Award
- We needed to monitor completion for the credit-taking students AND
- Monitor all, so that we could provide some kind of statement of accomplishment for all participants (e.g., number of weeks completed.



What we did

- Ten weeks with an assessment defined for each as "completion" of that week
- For 20 credits, students had to complete 5 weeks plus a poster in week 9
- For 10 credits students had to complete 3 weeks worth of activities plus the poster
- Anyone who completed one or more weeks gets a certificate

What we did

- Moodle completion tracking was turned on
- Completion tracking allows you to specify conditions that define when an activity is considered to be complete

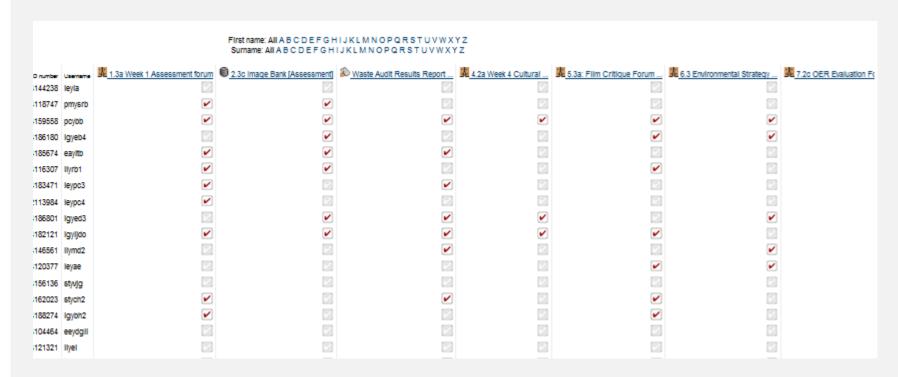
E.g.,

- Database (require grade to have been given)
- Forum (require number of posts or number of replies or number of either)

(There are other options to define 'completion'.)



Moodle then tracks when students satisfy that criterion



Navigation > SHORTNAME > Reports > Completion Tracking

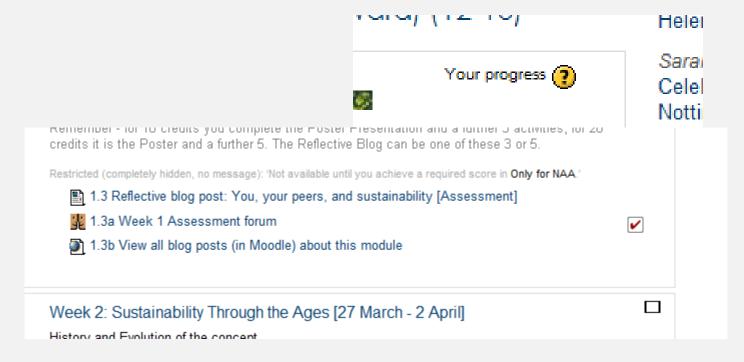


How it worked

- Easy to see which students had completed what
- Could sort them by group (e.g., all 10 credit students in China) once I'd set up the groups
- Could export the data to a spreadsheet and crunch the numbers
- Contacted individual students to advise them how many more activities they needed to do to get the credits



Completion tracking – student view



 Students really liked the ticks as they could see that they had successfully completed an assessment and thus the week

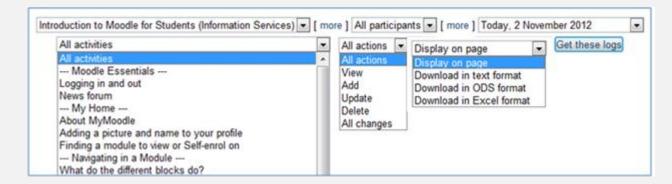

Issues, tips and recommendations

- In EXCEL, use the COUNTA function to count the number of cells that have value (Completed) then you get a quick total (with exported completion data).
- If you need to have a full record of participation (e.g., you're researching the data) download it every month or so as Moodle logs are only kept for 3 months.
- You can also allow students to mark resources and activities as complete themselves. Some students like to do this so they can keep track of their own learning.
